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AFTERCARE CODE OF CONDUCT

PARENTS

Educating children is a process that involves a partnership between parents, teachers, and the school community. For this reason, we continue to welcome and encourage parents/guardians to participate fully in the life of our aftercare children.

Without parental cooperation and commitment to a partnership of excellence within this aftercare facility, this institution would be unable to flourish and continue to strive for excellence.

Following the guidelines set out in our Code Of Conduct for learners, we expect parents / guardians and visitors to:

1. Respect the caring ethos and school pride.
2. Be an example and friendly towards the learners and staff.
3. Support aftercare in all disciplining actions.
4. Be willing to assist.
5. Understand that parents and teachers need to work together for the benefit of the children.
6. Encourage their children to be responsible and accountable at an age appropriate level.
7. Demonstrate that all members of the school community should be treated with respect and therefore set a good example in parents' speech and behaviour.
8. Correct your own child behaviour especially in public where it could lead to conflict, aggressive or unsafe behaviour.
9. Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern through the correct channels.
10. Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view first in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issues.
11. Avoid using staff as threats to admonish children's behaviour.

In order to support a peaceful and safe environment the aftercare cannot tolerate parents, caregivers and visitors exhibiting the following:

1. Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with operations of Aftercare teachers.
2. Use offensive or loud language, swearing, cursing, profane language or displaying temper.
3. Threatening to do bodily harm to a member of staff, fellow parent or pupil regardless of whether or not the behaviour constitutes a criminal offence.
4. Damaging or destroying school property.
5. Abusive/ threatening emails or text / voice/phone messages or other written communication.
6. Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of actions of this child towards their own. (Such an approach to that child may be seen as an assault on that child and may have legal consequences.)
7. Smoking and consumption of alcohol or other drugs whilst on school property. (Smoking is only allowed outside of school grounds.)
8. Any illegal substances or objects being brought on to the school premises.

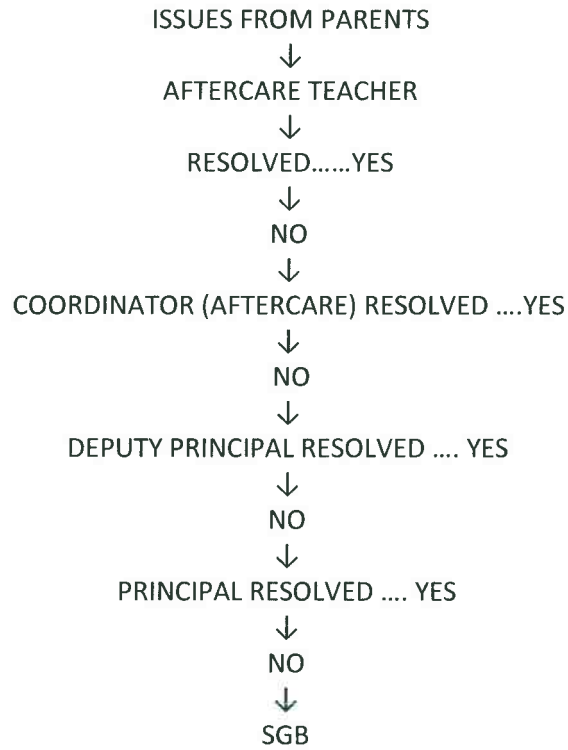
With regards to your child /ren's behavior, parents will be informed of serious misconduct through a letter or phone call and a meeting will be set up to discuss the issue.

Cell phone and Social Media Policy

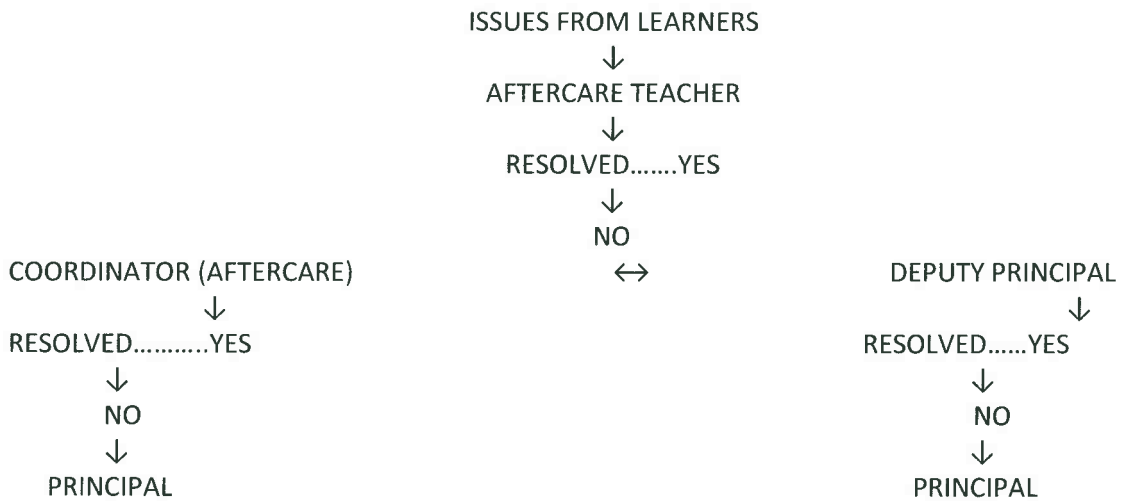

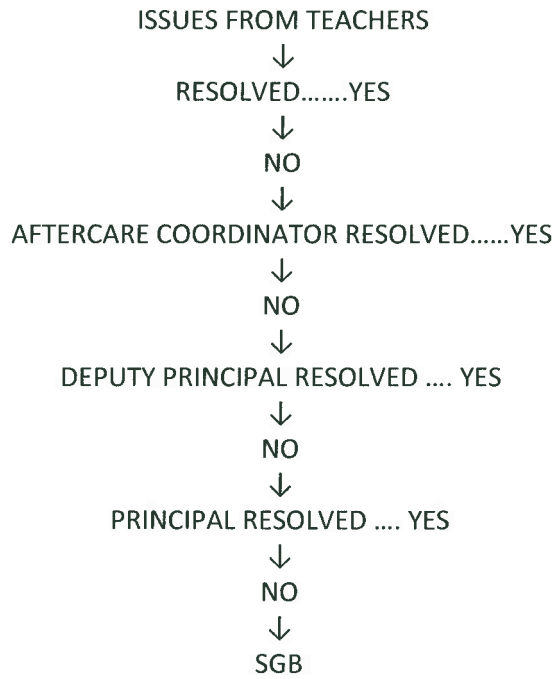
